Often called Discipleship, Faith Practices are the responsibilities promised in Baptism. During this season of Epiphany we've been talking much about Baptism. In Baptism we become children of God and, as a result, we live our lives striving to follow Christ, not only in our words, but also in our deeds.

These Faith Practices (promises) are from our Baptismal liturgy:

- Live among God's Faithful People
- Hear the Word of God and Share in the Lord's Supper
- Proclaim the Good News of God in Christ through Word and Deed
- Serve All People Following the Example of Jesus
- Strive for Justice and Peace in All The Earth.

Faithful people engage in Faith Practices as an act of trust pointed toward God. They are a way of being and following Christ's lead and pleasing God. Faith Practices are a clear way of pointing our lives at Christ. With special thanks to ELCA Discipleship website (<http://elca.org/Resources/Faith-Practices>), here are some opportunities:

"Live among God's Faithful People" means living a new life in Christ by caring for and encouraging others. It means celebrating God's presence in our lives by regular

participation in worship, fellowship, and the ministries of Our Father's. It means receiving God's blessings with great joy and returning a portion back to God through tithes and offerings.

And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."
(Matthew 28:18-20)

"Hear the Word of God and Share in the Lord's Supper" means not only listening to sermons, hearing scripture, and receiving the Eucharist, but also is participating in Bible study, forgiveness of sin, educational ministry and other things.

"Proclaim the Good News of God in Christ through Word and Deed" includes inviting others to the church where Christ is proclaimed; talking about our faith in our homes and with others that we might meet; offering encouragement to a friend and others who are ill or in need.

"Serve All People Following the Example of Jesus" serving was clearly at the heart of Jesus' ministry. When we follow the example of Jesus serving we have to get involved in the lives of others.

"Strive for Justice and Peace In All the Earth" as children of God we strive to ease the suffering in the world. A justice mindset is one way we practice our faith. A mindset and a heart filled with peace is faith in practice.

I believe each of these practices offer an invitation to enter into deeper relationship with Christ and his people. Consider these questions: What are you currently doing in your life that pleases God? How can you take a step in faithfulness this year? To consider and act, then, becomes a way of being intentional with Faith.

What Is Your Stewardship New Year's Resolution?

When we think of stewardship we often think in terms of money but as 2014 begins, think about what is the hardest resource to give? What would it look like to give that first? What resource is most difficult to steward? For me the hardest resource to give and to steward is time.



Stewardship is all about time. Time is God's gift of life, measured not in minutes, hours, days or years; but rather measured in opportunities to be present with one another, to love one another as God has first loved us and to serve one another. We volunteer for various organizations, including the church. We still believe time is ours to keep, to use, or even waste. Yet, God cares about how we use all of our time, not just the small percentage that we give away to worship, fellowship, spiritual practice and volunteering.

Like money, time is one of the resources that God has entrusted to our care to serve both God and neighbors. During 2014, do not focus solely on the ways that God is calling us to give our time to church, but how God is calling us to use all of our time to share God's love and grace with the world. How is God calling us to use our time to live into our many vocations: leader, spouse, mother, friends, Christian, neighbor, etc?

The story of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10) is one of the best examples of what stewardship of your whole life looks like. The Samaritan stops his journey, for the sake of his neighbor and is moved with compassion. This compassion changes his whole day. He gives away his day (time) to a stranger who is in need out of love and compassion. What does it look like to be available to love your neighbor even when it isn't convenient?
