

Our Father's News

Ash Wednesday (March 5) marks the beginning of Lent when Christians prepare for the death and resurrection of Jesus. In reflection and repentance, we consider Christ's sufferings and intentionally take up our own crosses.

To take up our crosses is to see the truth about ourselves, hear our shortcomings, examine our hearts, and find the hurts that need healing. We recognize both the wounding in our own hearts—and our part in wounding the hearts of others. Lent is not, however, about grief and anguish as much as it's about healing and hope.

Lent provides an opportunity to rethink how we live and develop new holy habits. Some give up things (television, candy, alcohol) during this season as a fast, while others take on a new practice of faith (worshiping, serving, praying). Lent is a time to be intentional with God's important stuff, God forgives us and heals our hearts.

On Ash Wednesday we gathered together in worship to recognize our mortality and our need for repentance. Ashes from the burned palm branches of our last Palm Sunday are placed on our foreheads as a sign of repentance.

Lent continues each Wednesday Evening with Soup Supper and Holden Evening Prayer Worship (March 12—April 9). Come share in Our Father's community, food, and worship led by our people. Soup suppers supported by free-will donations and served from 5:30—6:45 pm. Worship begins at 7:15 pm.

Our regular Saturday (5:00 pm) and Sunday (9:30 am) Worship continues each week through Palm Sunday (9:30 am April 13), when we enter Holy Week. During this week we'll seek to participate in Jesus' journey to the cross.

Consider joining us for Maundy Thursday (7:15 pm April 17) as we remember Christ's Last Supper. Maundy Thursday remembers the instructions Jesus gave his Disciples: to serve others, remember his sacrifice, and receive him in the Eucharistic meal. On Good Friday (April 18)

we remember Jesus' crucifixion and death. At 9:30 am we have family-friendly Worship and at 7:15 pm our traditional and meaningful Tenebrae Worship.

5:00 pm Saturday evening (April 19) is Easter Vigil. This ancient tradition is the first celebration of Christ's Resurrection. Together, we'll receive Holy Communion and celebrate multiple baptisms.

Tell us about your family:

You served on the Evangelism Committee prior to stepping in as President. Tell us about your work with that group.

The Evangelism Committee has been a life giving role for me, and the relationships I built working with three gifted ladies was amazing. The Evangelism Committee has implemented many important forms of outreach over the years including prayer crosses, pew bible bookmarks, visitor bags, the prayer chain, t-shirts with our new purpose statement and more. I was glad to be a part of it.

What is your favorite Bible verse and why?

The 23rd Psalm: “The Lord is my shepherd; I lack nothing. He lets me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside quiet waters, He refreshes my soul...” I find great comfort in this Psalm.

What made you decide to step in as President?

It has been a growing faith journey. First, leadership realized the need for a new church picture directory, and I decided to begin that work. Next I took on an official role as Council Rep for the Evangelism Committee. With God's help, three people joined the committee, and great things started happening. After that, I was asked to be Vice President and then moved up to President. As I look back, I've realized that each time I took on a new role, God supplied the energy and encouragement for me to try something new.

What are you most excited about in the year ahead?

The future is not clear, but I believe Our Father's has people of great talents and I look forward to God's plan for us.

Where do we need leaders and volunteers to Build Christ's Community in 2014?

It is my hope that many will feel God calling them to be a part of the work of Our Father's is entering into. There is opportunity everywhere for people's talents to help us see and realize God's plan. Where there's a will, God will find a way.

At the annual meeting in January, we learned that the plan for 2014 includes "deepening our journey" toward our statement of purpose, the Sabbath, Stewardship and Equipping Ministry. What does "deepening our journey" mean to you?

As a choir member, I think of it like a song of the heart. Deepening our journey means establishing a stronger heart connection with God through prayer and discerning what God has in store in these areas. It's not exactly clear what that means yet; but if the past is any indicator, God will surely guide us in the right direction.

At the end of this year, what do you to be able to say about 2014 at Our Father's?

Coming from Evangelism, my wish is that throughout the year, everyone will feel loved by God and the members of this community, and that all ages of our church family will find deep meaning in building relationships with one another and with God.

Every Tuesday and Thursday morning, I get up early and head out the door to the community center. Upon arrival I am warmly greeted by a tiny little woman, Denise. We gather together as she begins, "Welcome my yogi friends, during your practice today let go of whatever happened before you arrived and what will happen after you leave." Then we are invited to dedicate this time to something, someone, perhaps a word or thought. She also reminds us this time is for us. What if our journey through lent this year is like yoga class? We welcome everyone together, unburden ourselves from the past and not worry about what lies ahead. We encourage and perhaps even a challenge each other to dedicate this time, these forty days to God. It will be a time for us. A time to stop what we are doing and become aware of our breathing, our movement and posture—both physically and spiritually. A time to,

"Be still, and know that I am God.

I will be exalted among the nations,

I will be exalted in the earth!" Psalm 46:10

May your Lenten practice this year be dedicate to Jesus and His journey to the cross.

Harvesters of Hope



“TEAM Cheetah” at Our Fathers has taken on the challenge of supplying two, used, smaller combines to Iringa in Tanzania, to be used as mobile corn/maize shellers in the farmer cooperatives there. Cheetah has been very successful in showing farmers how to double and triple and even quadruple their yields, but shelling the harvest by the traditional stick method has now become a real “bottleneck”. Cheetah is buying all their surplus crop at guaranteed prices but it has to be shelled and cleaned first...before bagging and weighing by Cheetah staff.

Ray Menard, Cheetah’s founder, brought us this challenge last November and we have worked on the idea for several months now and have agreed with Ray that such an idea could be a great boost for their corn/maize operation and could actually work. So, we have started fundraising for this effort and have set a target of \$30,000. We hope that our congregation and the wider community will join with our team in making this a reality. Here is something “concrete” that we at Our Fathers can do that will make a real difference... this year... in people’s lives, many of them fellow Lutherans!

We would like to thank the Our Fathers Foundation and many others who have already contributed to the Cheetah Fund at Our Fathers. We expect to soon have the first combine at Our Fathers to show our contributors and to use in raising the necessary funds for transport to Africa!

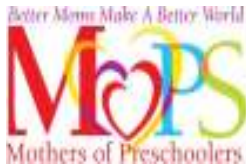
