In my time at OFLC, I've had the privilege of conducting funerals for various families. I think what is so interesting to me is how a family tends to come together, to find ways to love each other, to put conflict and annoyances aside, and a whole host of other things at the time of a loved one's death. Death provides us clarity about what is truly important in life, and provides us the energy to live into those things just a bit more than usual. And I think that is why it's so important to celebrate Jesus' death.




