Come Back Here!

I took my pooch, Hunter, on a camping trip one summer, and on the way I stopped for gas. Hunter jumped out of the car and started running toward the gas station door. I'm not sure if he wanted lottery tickets or a can of soda, or if he had any idea where he was going. I shouted rather forcefully — "Get back here," and to my surprise he obeyed and came trotting back to the car.

I wish it were that easy to regain church members who leave the flock, either suddenly or gradually. Why do people leave a congregation? Studies have been conducted over the years, and dozens of reasons have been mentioned by those who were surveyed. One study listed the following:

Rank Reason for Inactivity in Church

- 1. Apathetic, but intend to return
- 2. Self-sufficient without church (busy elsewhere)
- 3.1 don't belong here undeserving
- 4. Solitary Christian anti-institutional
- 5. Problem with worship cold, sterile, boring
- 6. Work schedule on weekends, youth in particular
- 7. Seeking meaning- haven't found it yet
- 8. Congregation not emphasizing personal relationship with Christ
- 9. Congregation provides and expects too little

OFLC Info PAGE 08 One look at the above list tells you it's not a simple matter of inactive folks being lazy or the Church being always at fault. A multitude of reasons exist: anger, boredom, shame, unbelief, rejection, apathy.... And many people leave gradually, so gradually that they and we in the church don't see it in time to take action. Interims are times when some people tend to be absent from worship.

The responsibility for intervening in someone's departure from the church is two-fold. First, as members you need to be self-aware. If you haven't attended worship for a few weeks or months, ask yourself why not? Is there some underlying concern or issue that needs attention? Is there someone you need to talk to? Where are you in your relationship with God? Be aware of what's happening in your walk of faith.

Secondly, we the Church must do our work well – preaching and practicing the Word, showing genuine concern for people in times of special need, offering opportunities for spiritual growth. We are not simply 'people pleasers' who will do or say anything that keeps folks content. We have a message to proclaim, a job to do, and sometimes it ruffles feathers. But we have to be sensitive to those who feel ignored, slighted, unwanted. Are you drifting away from Our Father's? You are an important part of this community. We are incomplete without you. So, as I said to Hunter, 'GET BACK HERE'!


